- This is an opportunity for our faith community to invest in needs of our parish and support important Catholic ministries for the poor and those in need, Saint Francis de Sales Seminary, Catholic schools and other vital ministries throughout the 10 counties of southeastern Wisconsin.
- [PARISH] will work toward achieving our goal of \$______I. Of the funds we raise, 60% will be for important needs of our parish—more if we exceed our goal.

iii. Early stages of the campaign:

- We are in the early stages of organizing our parish's effort.
- One of the first steps of the campaign is to form a volunteer committee for our parish. I would like your involvement as a volunteer.
- Please join me and other leaders from the parish next [DAY] [DATE] [TIME]

II. Possible responses to your request:

- I. "I have a conflict that night."
- I understand, but I hope you can be involved in the campaign. Your help is very important to me, will you join us the following week for a meeting here at the parish to learn more about our local needs? We will meet on [DAY] [DATE] [TIME] [LOCATION].
- i. "I don't really have time for this kind of commitment."
 - I can understand what you are saying. You are already a leader here at [PARISH] and are incredibly involved. I believe that this campaign is very important to our parish and would love your deeper involvement. But for right now, I ask that you come and learn, even if you are not able to dedicate much of your time. This is a very flexible commitment.
- ii. (If the answer is still "NO") Thank you for your consideration. Please keep the campaign in your prayers.

III. Volunteer Recruitment Tips: (Please note that you may have completed the first few steps)

- i. Work with your Parish Campaign Director to identify the families you want to invite to volunteer to help with the campaign.
- ii. <u>Make the request personal</u> families will respond when they are personally asked by their pastor or parish director to take on a leadership role.
- iii. <u>Recruit the Campaign Tri-Chairs first</u> The campaign tri-chairs should have lead pledge potential or significant connections/influence throughout the parish. (Please see Roles & Responsibilities.)
- iv. Recruit proportionate numbers to the parish size It lightens the load for everyone, brings more families into positions of leadership, creates a fun volunteer environment, and sets a positive tone for future volunteer recruitment. (Ideally one volunteer or couple per five family visits).
- v. A sample script: "John and Mary, I would like the two of you to stand with me and (the others already recruited) to make the Love One Another Campaign successful in our parish. I would like both of you to participate, and I am also recruiting another 30 or so couples and individuals because many hands will make light work. I am confident that you have the appropriate knowledge and experience with the parish to help me with this effort, and we will have the support of experienced, professional counsel through each step of the process. Our first meeting will be on [DAY] [DATE] [TIME] [LOCATION]."
- vi. <u>Avoid blanket recruiting (such as Finance or Pastoral Council asks as a whole)</u> This type of recruitment can create a feeling of obligation rather than enthusiastic leadership.

Please note we have prepared for you a detailed Volunteer Guide with many useful resources. Today we will use the summary guide in the form of a placemat—please follow along.

1. Role of a Volunteer

- Pray, Pledge, Share your passion, Invite participation, Follow up
- Sharing the story of the Love One Another Campaign in a face-to-face manner is the most effective fundraising tool we have.
- Meetings can take place in person at your or the parishioners' home, at the parish, or another quiet and appropriate location indoors or outdoors.
- Meetings can also be virtual through Zoom or another computer-based program.

2. Scheduling Visits

- After you schedule your visits, the rest is easy!
- When scheduling by phone or email, your only goal is to schedule a time to meet. You don't need to get into too many details before the visit.
- Begin by mentioning that you are calling on behalf of [PASTOR].
- [PASTOR] asked you to meet with them to discuss the Love One Another Campaign.
- The meeting with take approximately 30 minutes.
- Schedule the visit in a private, comfortable place.

Visit Scheduling Tips

- Set aside 30-minute blocks of time each week to make your calls and set appointments.
- The recommended standards for outreach are every 48 hours for a phone call, every 72 hours for a voicemail
- Send emails/texts as follow-ups to phone calls.
- If you can't reach someone after 2-3 tries, move on to the next family.
- Always suggest two specific times to meet. For example, "Would you prefer Tuesday at 9am or Wednesday at 5pm?"
- Before or after Mass is a great time to schedule a meeting.

3. Preparing for a Visit

- Become familiar with the campaign brochure and accompanying materials.
- Be upbeat a positive attitude goes a long way to convey that this campaign is worthy of support.
- Remove the envelope in the back pocket of the brochure and follow the instructions.

4. Conducting the Visit

- Open: (Start with light conversation, catch up, talk about last Sunday's homily, etc.)
- **Pray:** the campaign prayer together.
- Review: the parish and archdiocesan case elements by using the brochure as a guide. Focus on the needs that appeal most to you and the family. Speak from the heart, conveying your passion.
- Ask if they have questions on the materials (use the FAQ). If you don't know the answer, it is ok to say, "I'll find that out for you and let you know tomorrow."
- Invite: The family will be wondering how they can help.
- Verbalize the request in the letter from [PASTOR] in the back pocket of the brochure. Make the request your own, practice it before you visit. "Mary and John, you are generous and engaged members of our parish. Only you know your ability to pledge to this important campaign. [PASTOR] is asking all parish families to make their best campaign pledges. [PASTOR]'s letter in the back pocket of the brochure asks you to prayerfully consider a pledge of [\$MONTHLY SUGGESTION] per month for 60 months, for a total pledge of \$[TOTAL REQUEST]. Would you be able to make such a pledge?

Pause: Allow the family to respond. (Pause and take a drink of water or say a Glory Be)

Handle the Response:

The family will likely respond in one of four(4) ways

- Yes, we can make the requested pledge. Wonderful! Be the first to thank them for their pledge. Offer the pledge card, assist in its completion and place in the envelope provided. Return the envelope with the completed pledge card and any initial payment to the parish.
- We need some time to pray. This is a common response. Thank them for their prayerful consideration of the pledge request and ask if you can stop by in three(3) to seven(7) days with their pledge card to record the decision.
- We can't pledge \$200 per month, but we can pledge \$100 per month. If the offer of a pledge at a lower amount is in the spirit of the request, gratefully accept the pledge. You might suggest further consideration and prayer if it seems appropriate.
- No, we will not be able to support the campaign at this time. You might ask if there are any questions or misunderstandings about the campaign that would help them change their mind. If not, thank them for their time and ask for their continued prayers. Sometimes families who initially decline change their minds.
- 5. Follow-Up: The follow-up should take about 15 minutes. If a follow up visit is needed, schedule one before you leave the meeting It is best to schedule a time three(3) to seven(7) days after the initial request. It is very helpful to send a thank-you note/email/text to conclude the interaction and confirm the follow-up date and time.

Frequently Asked Questions by Parish Families

A. Campaign Related

1. What is the Love One Another Campaign?

The Love One Another Campaign is to prepare for the next generation of Catholics in our 10 counties of southeastern Wisconsin. Its goal is to raise pledges totaling \$150 million for needs in our parishes, helping the poor, and providing new and strengthened Catholic ministries across the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

2. Which parishes are participating in the Love One Another Campaign and how will they participate? All 188 parishes are taking part in four parish "waves" from summer 2021 to mid-2023. Parishes will conduct their own Love One Another Campaign efforts, supported by a campaign team.

3. Why is now the right time for the Love One Another Campaign?

Love One Another was paused during the pandemic to focus on the needs of our parish communities. The needs addressed by Love One Another continue, and we are now able to return our focus to the campaign.

4. How will Love one Another strengthen parishes?

Sixty percent (60%) of the funds raised, \$90 million of the overall campaign goal, will fund local parish needs identified by pastors, parish directors, and parish leadership.

5. How are parish goals set?

Parish goals are 140 percent of parish offertory for the 2019 fiscal year. The goals are not assessments.

6. How will campaign funds be allocated?

Sixty percent (60%) of pledges made and fulfilled by families in a parish will be used for the parish's stated needs. The remaining funds will be distributed based on the percentages allocated to each Catholic ministry in the campaign case statement.

7. Who will be asked to participate?

Every individual and family in the Archdiocese will be asked to prayerfully consider making their best campaign pledge.

8. How will campaign funds be administered?

A trust has been established for the sole purpose of receiving and disbursing funds raised through the Love One Another campaign for the uses and purposes set forth in the campaign and no other purposes.

9. Besides pledging, in what ways can people help the campaign?

All are asked to pray for the success of the Love One Another Campaign and for the parishes and ministries it serves. Also, every parish needs volunteers to help carry out the campaign. Please contact your parish office to volunteer.

Frequently Asked Questions by Parish Families Continued

B. Giving

1. Why emphasize pledges?

Pledging is a way to allow individuals and families to fulfill their generosity over time and eliminate what might be a burden to give all at once.

2. Why does my pledge request letter ask for a specific amount?

A pledge amount is suggested to help your parish reach its goal. Prayerful consideration should be given to making a pledge in proportion to one's blessings. Every pledge is important and appreciated.

3. Why are donors asked to complete and sign pledge cards; are they legally binding?

A pledge to the Love One Another Campaign is a promise to do one's best to give as stated on the pledge card. A signed pledge card is not legally binding and should a donor's finances change a pledge can be adjusted accordingly.

4. How are pledge payments made?

Donors may choose to fulfill their campaign pledge with monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual payments by check, credit card, automatic bank withdrawal, or qualified IRA distributions (age 70.5 or above). The Archdiocese will process each gift and provide gift acknowledgments and tax letters.

5. Are gifts to the campaign tax-deductible?

Gifts to the Love One Another Campaign are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law. Please consult your tax advisor regarding your specific situation.

6. Are gifts of stock or other non-cash gifts accepted?

Yes. The Love One Another Campaign accepts gifts of stock, and some non-cash gifts. Please contact Bob Pfundstein at 414-769-3583 or <u>pfundsteinb@archmil.org</u> for more information.

C. Other

1. Is the Catholic Stewardship Appeal taking place during the campaign?

Yes, the Catholic Stewardship Appeal will continue to be conducted annually. The Catholic Stewardship Appeal provides for the operational needs of the Archdiocesan Church on a year-to-year basis. The Love One Another Campaign is to meet extraordinary current and future needs of the greater southeastern Wisconsin Catholic community.

2. What became of the proceeds from the Faith In Our Future campaign?

\$83 million was collected from pledges. \$46 million addressed individual parish needs. \$11 million was disbursed in grants in support of the Faith In Our Future Trust initiatives. The remainder is in a designated Trust specially created for long term use. Full details can be found on the Trust website www.faithinourfuture.org.



Frequently Asked Questions By Parish Leaders and Volunteers

1. Why emphasize pledges payable over 60 months, (five years)?

Most families can make larger gifts when they are budgeted and paid for in installments over 60 months, (five years).

2. Why are donors asked to complete and sign pledge cards?

We ask donors to sign their pledge cards to confirm their intentions to give. Pledges are not legally binding and can be changed in donors' circumstances change.

3. Why is an initial payment requested?

If a donor is able, they are encouraged to make an initial payment. An initial payment is a strong indication of a donor's commitment to completing a campaign pledge.

4. How should pledge payment checks be made payable?

Checks for pledge payments should be made payable to "Love One Another Campaign." Donors may write the name of their parish in the memo space on their check.

5. Can a donor restrict their gift to a specific element of the campaign case, including their parish?

Donors are encouraged to give to all the areas of need in the of Love One Another Campaign case for support. A donor may restrict their gift to one or more of the campaign case elements. If a donor restricts a gift entirely to the parish case, the 60% parish and 40% ministries split of all the parish's gifts will be honored.

6. Why do donors place their completed pledge cards and initial payments in sealed envelopes to be mailed for processing?

Completed pledge cards and initial payments are placed in sealed envelopes to:

- a. allow donors who choose to use them protect confidential information.
- b. keep credit card information confidential.

The sealed envelopes should only be opened by the bank that processes the pledges and payments. Campaign funds, including cash gifts, should not be deposited into parish bank accounts.

7. How will pledge cards and initial payments be sent from the parish to the Archdiocese to be processed and acknowledged?

During the active phase of the campaign, the Pilot Phase, Wave 1, Wave 2 or Wave 3, the parish will be provided tamper-proof envelopes to mail pledges and initial payments to a campaign-designated lockbox for gift processing and accounting.

8. Who will acknowledge pledges and provide tax letters?

- a. Parishes are encouraged to send their own thank you letters to their donors.
- b. Donors will receive thank you letters from Archbishop Listecki for their gifts and pledges.
- c. All donors will receive annual tax letters from the Archdiocese.
- **9.** How will the pledges be collected? The Archdiocese is responsible for pledge collection. The Archdiocese will mail pledge payment reminders to those paying by check according to the donors' chosen payment schedules. Donors paying by credit card or automatic withdrawal will receive annual statements as reminders of their ongoing pledge payments.

10. When and how will our parish receive its share of the funds paid by our parishioners? Will the parish be assessed for these funds?

The parish share of funds collected will be allocated to the Love One Another Trust upon receipt from the donor. Disbursements of these funds into a restricted parish account will be made on a quarterly basis. The parish must request a proxy to use its funds in accordance with the parish case statement. These funds are not subject to the annual Archdiocesan assessment.

11. Will the Love One Another Campaign affect parish offertory?

Parish offertory generally remains constant during campaigns of this nature with proper communication and planning.

12. How should our parish plan to conduct its annual offertory appeal and the Catholic Stewardship Appeal?

Parishes should be able to conduct their annual parish offertory appeals and the Catholic Stewardship Appeal as scheduled and planned.

13. What if a family can only give to the Love One Another Campaign by reducing its gifts to the parish or the Catholic Stewardship Appeal?

Giving to the Love One Another Campaign is meant to be over-and-above a family's regular giving to the Church; that takes priority.

14. Is corporate matching accepted as a way to increase the impact of one's pledge?

Yes, if your company has a matching program, this is a great way to increase or even double your pledge. All corporate matching inquiries should be directed to your HR or finance departments. Please contact the campaign office at the number below with questions.

Roles & Responsibilities - Pastor/Parish Director

As the spiritual leader of the community, the Pastor/Parish Director is the campaign's chief spokesperson and greatest advocate within the parish. Parishioners will look to him or her for leadership, spiritual guidance, and support. With the Pastor's/Parish Director's support of the fundraising plan and commitment to the vision and goals it outlines, the parish is sure to enjoy a successful campaign.

The Pastor/Parish Director:

- Prays for the success of the campaign and serves as its spiritual leader in the parish.
- Supports the campaign case and plan by demonstrating an interest and concern for the program and the good works that it will accomplish.
- Considers a meaningful pledge to the campaign.
- Helps to implement the Stewardship portion of the campaign.
- Devotes sufficient time each week to the campaign including training and reporting meetings and weekly meetings with the assigned Parish Campaign Director.
- Recruits competent and credible lay leaders to the Campaign Executive Committee.
- Helps to identify prospective Major Gift donor families and makes select visits.
- Announces the campaign at the appropriate time designated by the campaign timetable.
- Attends training and report meetings.
- Delivers pulpit announcements in accordance with the campaign timetable and speaks positively about the campaign.

Roles & Responsibilities - Your Assigned Parish Campaign Director

A parish campaign director assists the parish throughout the campaign. The parish campaign director will:

- Assist in preparation of all campaign operational materials.
- Assist the Pastor/Parish Director with identification of top prospects and leadership team recruitment.
- Brief the Pastor/Parish Director and campaign leadership throughout the campaign.
- Lead volunteer orientation and training sessions.
- Coordinate distribution of campaign promotional materials.
- Provide professional campaign direction at all phases of the campaign.
- Assist in pledge documentation and redemption procedures.



Roles & Responsibilities - Campaign Chairs

The Campaign Tri-Chairs help lead the parish campaign. The Campaign Tri-Chairs should possess the following qualities:

- Demonstrate leadership.
- Identify with success.
- Know the parish well.
- Make pledges that provide leadership examples for other families.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- Coordinate the Love One Another Campaign together with the Pastor and Parish Campaign Director.
- Assist in leading the program and motivating others to work for the campaign.
- Encourage volunteers to follow the procedures outlined in the campaign plan.
- Assist Pastor/Parish Director to identify and visit Leadership (\$50,000+) and Major (\$25,000+) gift level families.

The Campaign Tri-Chairs should dedicate two to four hours each week to the campaign. Additional time may be required during the first few weeks. The Campaign Tri-Chairs:

- Lead campaign report and training meetings.
- Participate in planning meetings with the Pastor, Parish Campaign Director, and other campaign volunteers.
- Serve as visible leaders for the campaign through recruitment efforts and in parish meetings, optional receptions, and announcements, as appropriate.

Roles & Responsibilities - Campaign Volunteers

Campaign volunteers should be engaged parish leaders and supporters of the parish community. Volunteers are asked to support the campaign and:

- Pray for the success of the Love One Another Campaign
- Make their own best five-year pledge to the campaign
- Advocate for the campaign and share their passion for the case for support.
- Attend campaign report meetings in person or virtually.
- Visit with fellow parishioners to invite their support for the campaign.
- Follow up with parish families after inviting their support and receive their best pledges.
